**FROM THE TEAM LEADER

Have you ever watched geese fly? They fly in a V formation, the one in front is flying point and the others follow to form the V. In a V formation the whole flock adds at least 71% more flying range than if they flew alone. Whenever a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to fly alone and quickly gets back into formation. Like the geese-people who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going and easier than those who try to go it alone. When a goose gets tired, it rotates back into the formation and another goose flies at the point position. If people had as much sense, they would realize that ultimately their success depends on working as a team, taking turns doing the hard tasks and sharing leadership. Geese in the rear of the formation honk to encourage those up front to speed up, it is important that our “honking from behind” be encouraging, otherwise it’s just - well- honking. When a goose gets sick or wounded two other geese drop out of formation and follow it down to help and provide

protection. They stay with the unhealthy member of the flock until it is either able to fly again or dies, then they fly to catch up with their flock or launch out with another passing flock. **MAY WE BE SO SACRIFICIAL THAT WE BE WORTHY OF SUCH FRIENDS!!!** I have shared this to show that even in nature Christ has put the natural instinct to be part of a group, to help, to comfort, and to care; in us as humans He has put those same instincts. **KONT # 25** is not about Debra, I am not the leader, but am only flying at point for a time, and there are times when I need to fall back and allow a team mate to take the point position. This story is what Kairos is all about, the women who come to the Weekend as a guest are in the back and we need to nurture them as they heal and gain strength and then one day they may be able to fly in the point position. 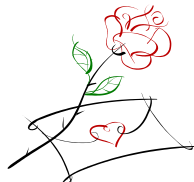
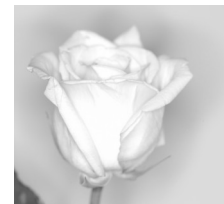
PSALM 95
